Contributed to initiative successes including creation of the first citywide HCV prevalence estimate and several publications in peer-reviewed journals.
- Developed and implemented SFDPH's response to viral hepatitis. Designed, implemented, and managed SFDPH's first HCV linkage programs and primary carebased HCV treatment initiative. Oversaw programmatic changes that yielded increases in community-based testing by 52% between 2016 and 2017, and primary care-based HCV treatment by 112% between 2015 and 2017.
- Developed strategy and managed contracts for \$1.3 million in federal, state, and local funds for services for PEH. Presented at an average of three to four national conferences each year on best practices related to hepatitis C elimination and health.
