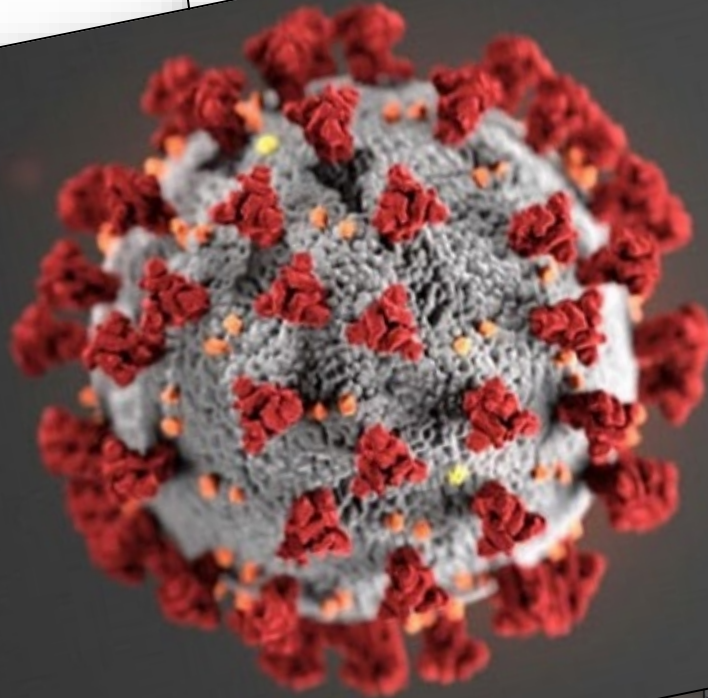

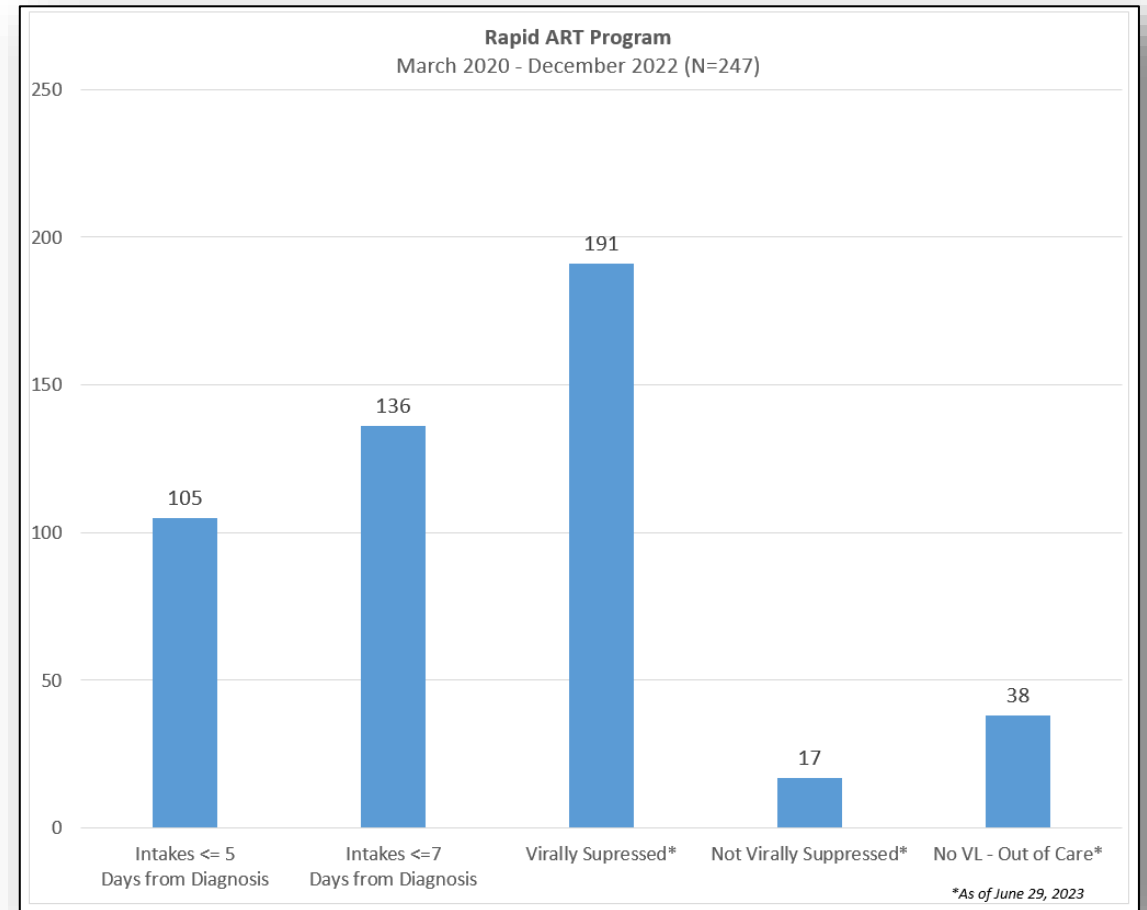

 - STD Clinic – 438 Clients Enrolled in PrEP Services
- Transgender Community Engagement
- Rapid ART Program

- STD Clinic Referral Coordinator

■ Increased Communication and Collaboration

LESSONS LEARNED

- Engaging with community at all levels regularly, not just during planned sessions
- Being prepared for internal barriers and how to navigate county processes with program that we didn't have prior engagement
- The need to reduce even more barriers for clients to access services
- Need to support staff providing these services...without them these services cant occur
 - STD/HIV Clinic had over 20 vacancies in 2021/2022
 - Retention of staff is KEY!
 - Need More Hands on Training, Team Building, Wellness Programs, Stress Reduction
