


Key Features of San Bernardino County's HIV Epidemic (2018)



Geographic barriers to care acces

San Bernardino County Situational Analysis:

Selected Needs, Gaps and Strengths

Pillars: Test, Treat, Prevent, Respond

Needs/Gaps

Regional differences in services distribution: less service infrastructure desert/rural regions

No ROOT in Jails

Increasing HIV infection

Increasing STIs

Need to scale up culturally specific PrEP/prevention interventions especially for Latinx and B/AA

Lack of affordable housing and transportation

Strengths

Strong community-based testing and routine ED testing

Solid network of HIV primary care clinics, but clinical provider shortages

Progress in coordination but HIV services still siloed

Affected by HIV Voices nor Let at table

Critical voices; Critical focus of EtHE

- B/AA and Latinx men who have sex with men (MSM); esp. under 24
- Substance users
- Trans women of color
- B/AA women
- People experiencing homelessness
- PrEP eligible individuals

Interventions

- Self-Testing-Building Healthy Online Communities/TakeMeHome
- Rapid Response Team (RRT)
- Embedded DIS in Emergency Departments
- Mobile Services Collaborations: InnROADS
- Expanded HIV Prevention Services to People who Inject Drugs/People Experiencing Homelessness
