

Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) – Women's Preventive Services Initiative HRSA is an agency of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services that operates programs intended to provide equitable health care to people who are geographically isolated and economically or medically vulnerable.

- HRSA contracts with an external organization, currently ACOG, to convene a panel of experts, the Women's Preventive Services Initiative (WPSI) to make and update recommendations for women's preventive services.
- HRSA can accept or reject recommendations which determines insurance coverage requirements.



Published September 2021

- This infographic includes data on new HIV diagnoses among cisgender and transgender women, as well as information on PrEP and U=U. There is also a QR Code and link to HIV care and treatment, housing, and domestic violence resources.
- As of September 2022, the English version of the infographic has been downloaded 172 times by unduplicated computers/smartphones and the Spanish version has been downloaded 34 times.



# Women's Committee Advocacy

 As a result of the Women's Committee advocacy, the Ending the Epidemics: Integrated Strategic Plan Overview was updated October 2022 to include "Cisgender women and all people who can become pregnant" as a focus population.

#### The priority populations are: People of color, especially Blacks/ Young people African Americans, Latinx, (aged 15-29 years) & Indigenous people Gay and bisexual men, and People who are trans or other men who have sex gender non-conforming with men People who use drugs, including People experiencing people who inject drugs homelessness People who exchange sex for People who are drugs, housing, and/or other incarcerated resources Migrant and immigrant Cisgender women and other communities, including people people who can become pregnan who are undocumented
